Horse Show Rules

I. GENERAL

- A. Peninsula Equestrian Circuit, Inc. ("PEC") follows both the United States Equestrian Federation ("USEF") guidelines and the PEC rules. In the event of a rule conflict, PEC rules prevail.
- B. All California drug laws apply.
- C. The decision of the judge is final. Exhibitors are prohibited from approaching the judge in the event of a protest. All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by \$50.00 to the horse show committee within 24 hours of event. To lodge a complaint, the exhibitor must send a concise report of the offense via e-mail to Nicole Lean at PeninsulaEquestrianCircuit@gmail.com. Exhibitor must provide proof of horse/exhibitor eligibility in the event of a protest. If an exhibitor is disqualified as a result of the protest, his or her points for the disputed class/event will be withdrawn. Points will be adjusted accordingly.
- D. A "RELEASE, WAIVER AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT" form must be signed at each event by every exhibitor and person handling horses (which includes trainers, grooms, and volunteers) who have not signed "A RELEASE, WAIVER AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT" for the current show year. A parent or legal guardian must sign "A RELEASE, WAIVER AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT" for an exhibitor (Junior Member) under 18 years of age.
- E. All horses/ponies on the show grounds, if being ridden, must have on a bridle. Horses/ponies may not be ridden in any type of halter/rope halter while on the show grounds. If any person is unable to handle a horse safely and responsibly, he or she will be excused from the show grounds for the safety of the exhibitor, the horse, and others. If any person is unable to control a horse in a class, arena or other area which creates a dangerous condition for self or others, the person will be asked to leave the arena or area. This authority vests with any officer or board member of PEC.
- F. In the interest of safety, NO child, except an EXHIBITOR, may be inside any arena at any time. NO EXCEPTIONS! Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times on the show grounds. Children may not play within six (6) feet of any arena rail, including the bleachers. Show management has the authority to enforce any and all safety rules. Failure to follow these safety rules may result in expulsion from the event and show grounds.
- G. ASTM/SEI safety-approved helmets must be worn by any person mounted on a horse on the show grounds, regardless if the rider is an EXHIBITOR or spectator.
- H. All dogs must be on a leash and may not be within two (2) feet of the arenas' rails for the safety of the exhibitor, the horse, and others. Dogs barking or causing a commotion close to the arenas will be requested to be moved away from the arena rails and office area.
- I. No alcoholic beverages are permitted on the show grounds.
- J. NO vehicles except trucks attached to trailers may park in the trailer parking area. There is a 15-minute maximum "drop off" period allowed for vehicles to park in the trailer area to facilitate exhibitors dropping off personal items and tack. Vehicles not attached to trailers must park in the designated parking lot or risk the vehicle or trailer being towed at the owner's expense.
- K. Stabling will be available on a first come, first served basis at a fee of \$125 per stall regardless of type—inside permanent, pipe stall permanent, or portable stabling. **Stall reservations/cancellations must be made by 5:00 p.m. on the Monday preceding the horse show** by contacting Barn Manager Larry Lean via text or voice mail at (310) 293-0108. **Stabling fees are non-refundable** – if you reserve a stall and do not cancel it by the deadline, or you are a no-show, you are still responsible for paying for the stall.
- L. All riders participating in a PEC horse show must be members of the Peninsula Equestrian Circuit organization.

II. CLASS ENTRY FEES AND REQUIREMENTS

- A. No refunds without reasonable written proof confirming legitimate reason from veterinarian or medical doctor. Refunds will be mailed within 14 days of proof.
- B. Class entries for each class will be closed five (5) minutes prior to the time the class starts. To scratch a class without a fee, the horse show office (not the back gate) must be notified before the class starts. If the class is scratched after the class starts, the class entry fee will not be refunded. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to communicate add/scratches between the entry booth and the back gate. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
- C. Proper attire is required in all classes to compete in the class. The judge may determine that hunt coats are optional in the event of extreme heat. The only exception is the Leadline classes where boots, long pants, and ASTM/SEI safety-approved helmet are the only requirements.
- D. PEC reserves the right to combine classes with fewer than three entries. Classes may be canceled at PEC's discretion for lack of exhibitors. PEC reserves the right to hold classes out of numerical order during the course of the show (i.e., classes canceled or combined will change the order). Flat classes with 16 or more riders will be split and double prizes will be awarded with the standard point allocation. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know when and where the classes are run.
- E. If there is only one exhibitor in the class, whether the class is combined with another class or the class is run with one exhibitor, the solo exhibitor will receive points, a ribbon, and \$25 credit for prizes. If the solo exhibitor chooses not to show in the class, a refund will be issued for that class.
- F. Schooling is permitted at the discretion of the judge as long as the horse and rider are eligible for the class entered. Schooling entries must inform the back gate when entering for schooling and must wear their number upside down. Schooling rounds are not judged. Points and ribbons are not awarded for schooling.
- G. Horse must show under the same name all year.

III. HORSE AND EXHIBITOR

- A. No stallions will be permitted on the show grounds. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
- B. Exhibitor's age as of December 1st of previous year is the current year show age.
- C. An "amateur rider" is an exhibitor who, unlike a "professional," does not accept payment for any of the following: riding, training, showing in halter, schooling, conducting clinics, seminars or instruction. PEC endorses USEF rules regarding amateur riders.
- D. "Leadline" is open to any rider who has not shown in any performance class other than Leadline prior to December 31st of the previous year. English or Western attire is acceptable. Lead shanks must be attached to a halter under the bridle.
- E. English "walk-trot" (W/T) classes are open to any exhibitor who did and does not show at the canter in any discipline for the show year or December 31st of the previous year. Exhibitors showing in any flat Walk-Trot class may only show in Walk-Trot classes. Horse/rider combination must maintain the same "walk-trot" status all year in that specific W/T division. Riders may show in the Walk-Trot division for two years in one age group or split between the age groups if the rider's age warrants.

IV. POINTS AND AWARDS

- A. To be a daily show Champion or Reserve Champion in a division, the exhibitor must be a member of PEC. A Champion for a division will be the exhibitor who has the highest number of points in that division for that show. In the event of a tie for Champion, the exhibitor with the highest number of points over fences will be the Champion. The Reserve Champion for a division will be the exhibitor who has the second highest number of points in that division. In the event of a tie for Reserve Champion, the exhibitor with the highest number of points over fences will be the Reserve Champion. Points are based on placement. Ties are determined by equitation over fences and flat equitation placings.
- B. Year End High Point Awards. All Exhibitors who are members of PEC are eligible for high point awards. Points are calculated on the rider. Highest number of accumulated division points wins. Points are as follows: 1st place—9 points, 2nd place—7 points, 3rd place—6 points, 4th place—5 points, 5th place—

4 points, 6th place—3 points, 7th place—2 points and 8th place—1 point. Rider will be awarded highest placing in a division they competed in. Rider can participate in additional high point divisions.

C. Any questions or discrepancy must be addressed to the Show Manager and made within 30 days of the show date where the discrepancy appeared or the date of points publication. Points are posted on the PEC website (PeninsulaEquestrianCircuit.com) shortly after the conclusion of each show. After 30 days following publication, the points will stand as published.

V. CLASS DESCRIPTIONS AND CROSS ENTRY RESTRICTIONS

A. **Warmup** classes are supervised, unjudged classes over a designated course. In order to participate riders must pre-enter as a regular class. Each rider must wear a number. The class is open to all riders as long as jumping the warmup round does not exceed the fence height for their division. These classes do not count toward any high point prize for daily nor year-end awards in any division. Each hunter division with the exception of the Walk-Trot divisions will have a warmup class offered at that fence height.

B. **Clean & Win** class is a warmup jumper class in which each rider entered will earn a blue ribbon for a clean round. No time, no points, **no prize** for completion of a warmup round in this class; a clean round will be determined by the judge.

C. **Walk-Trot** and **Leadline** classes are open to English and Western riders who have not shown at the canter at any show. Riders may not cross enter into any class that requires cantering or jumping. Riders are eligible to compete in the Walk-Trot division for two years, commencing with their first show. Schooling equipment is allowed in Walk-Trot classes.

- i. Riders in the Challenge classes will be asked to perform at least three of the following tests in addition to working as a group at the walk and trot in both directions of the ring during the Flat Equitation Challenge. Riders in the Equitation over Poles Challenge will perform individually over the "course" of poles and also be required to perform at least three of the following tests: (1) stop; (2) drop and pick up stirrups at the halt; (3) sit the trot; (4) circle; (5) back; (6) shorten or lengthen stride at the walk; (7) answer basic questions related to horses and riding.

- ii. Riders in the Walk-Trot over Poles classes will individually trot over ground poles.

D. Horses and riders in the **Flat** division are not restricted as to prior experience. No cross entry to any class other than Cross Rails or Tiny Timbers.

E. **Cross Rails** division classes are restricted to horse and rider combinations who have not shown over a course of fences **other than cross rails** prior to the first PEC show of the season. No cross entry with Walk-Trot. Cross entry is permitted to the Flat and Tiny Timbers divisions. Fences are cross rails.

F. **Cross Rail Jumpers** division classes are restricted to horse and rider combinations who have not shown over a course of fences **other than cross rails** prior to the first PEC show of the season. Cross rails course with lines and changes of direction.

G. **Tiny Timbers** over fences classes consisting of a cross rails course with lines and changes of direction. Open to horse and rider combinations who have not shown over a course of fences **other than cross rails** prior to the first show of the season. Rider may trot and/or canter the course. Simple changes will not be penalized. Cross entries allowed to **either** Cross Rails division if the rider is eligible for the Cross Rails division or Green Rider, but not both.

H. **Green Rider** division classes are restricted to riders who have never shown over a course of fences 2' or higher prior to the first show. No cross entry for rider to classes in divisions that contain over fences classes with fences 2' or higher. Horsemanship/Green Rider Medal okay. Trotting (any amount) will not be penalized in over fences classes. Fences 1'6".

I. **Rusty, Long, and Short Stirrup** (fences 2') division classes are restricted to riders who have never shown over a course of fences 2'3" or higher. No cross entry for rider to classes in divisions that contain over fences classes with fences higher than 2'3".

J. Riders in the **Low Modified** (fences 2'3") and **Children/Adult Amateur** (fences 2'6") and **Junior/Amateur** (fences 2'9" – 3') divisions are not restricted as to prior experience. No cross entry into classes in divisions that contain fences less than 2' for Low Modified, less than 2'3" for Children/AA, and less than 2'6" for Modified.

K. **Junior/Adult Amateur** (fences 2'9" – 3'). No restrictions as to prior show experience. Open to all junior and amateur riders.

L. Riders who feel that complying with the eligibility requirements for any division will constitute undue hardship may petition to the PEC Board in writing for an exemption before the show in question.

M. The **Peninsula Equestrian Circuit Horsemanship/Green Rider Medal, Intermediate Medal, and Advanced Medal** classes are open to Junior and Amateur riders of PEC. Riders qualify for the Finals class at the last show by participating in the class at shows held during the season. Riders may continue to ride in Medal classes after they have qualified. Medal classes to be judged as an equitation class over a course of fences. Two or more tests of the top three riders are required. A rider who does not return for testing will be placed last of those called back to test. Finals winners will receive a trophy and a prize, and will be ineligible for that Medal class in the future.

- i. **PEC Horsemanship/Green Rider Medal (fences 1'6")** – Restricted to riders who have never competed over a course of fences 2' or higher. No cross entry to classes with fences 2' or higher or to any other medal class at the same show (including the show with the finals). Course must include at least two changes of direction. Trot changes not penalized. USEF Tests 1-9 (refer to www.usef.org).
- ii. **PEC Intermediate Medal (fences 2'0")** – Restricted to riders who have never competed over a course of fences 2'3" or higher. No cross entry to any other medal class (including the show with the finals). Course must include at least one of the following: bending line, fence at the end of the ring, roll-back turn. USEF Tests 1-13 (refer to www.usef.org).
- iii. **PEC Advanced Medal (fences 2'6")** – Course must include at least two of the following: bending line, roll-back turn, fence at the end of the ring, long approach to a single jump. USEF Tests 1-19 (refer to www.usef.org).

N. **CROSS ENTRY RESTRICTIONS** – **Walk-Trot** riders in either age category may not enter any other division for the entire season to maintain eligibility for annual awards in that division, including the last show of the season. **Flat division** is open to riders in the Cross Rails or Tiny Timbers divisions only. Classes in the flat division will be divided at the show manager's discretion if entries exceed 16 riders. **Tiny Timbers** riders are restricted in experience to having shown only in Cross Rails divisions prior to the first show. Tiny Timbers may cross enter into the Cross Rails division for one season if they have only shown in the Cross Rails division prior to the first show of the season, **OR** Tiny Timbers may cross enter into the Green Rider division if they wish, but will then be ineligible to show in Cross Rails division. If a rider enters both Tiny Timbers and Green Rider divisions, they may enter the Horsemanship/Green Rider Medal class. **Jumper classes** are not restricted to prior experience. Cross entry is permitted between two (2) jumper divisions that are adjacent on the schedule, the exception is that Clean & Win is open to all riders. Note there is a 12-class limit per horse including Warmup classes, Walk-Trot classes, and Leadline class.

Note: ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN OPEN, SIGNED CHECK MADE PAYABLE TO "PENINSULA EQUESTRIAN CIRCUIT." Riders must also sign the PEC Waiver & Release and become a member of PEC (annual membership expires every February 28, before the show season starts.)
